DEA through their Office of Diversion Control is responsible to prevent, detect and investigate diversion of pharmaceutical controlled substances and regulated chemical products. To determine that practitioners such as veterinarians are in compliance with the Control Substances Act and DEA regulations, DEA conducts unannounced inspections of registrants to determine that no theft or diversion of controlled substances and regulated chemicals has been done by the registrant. Therefore, it is important that veterinarians fully understand the role of DEA and the consequences for not abiding with federal or State laws and regulations. |
